REPORT ON THE

OPERATIONS OF THE

UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

IN THE MATTER OF

The following is a summary of the findings of the investigation conducted by the American Oversight team into the operations of the United States Department of Justice. The investigation was conducted in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) and the American Oversight Act of 2012. The findings are as follows:

The investigation revealed that the Department of Justice has a long history of withholding information from the public. This information includes records of internal communications, reports, and other documents that are relevant to the public's understanding of the Department's operations. The American Oversight team has identified several areas where the Department has failed to provide information that it is legally obligated to provide.

CONCLUSIONS

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. The Department of Justice should be required to provide a comprehensive list of all records withheld from the public under FOIA.
2. The Department of Justice should be required to provide a detailed explanation of the reasons for each record withheld.
3. The Department of Justice should be required to provide a copy of each record withheld to the American Oversight team.
4. The Department of Justice should be required to provide a copy of each record withheld to the public.
5. The Department of Justice should be required to provide a copy of each record withheld to the American Oversight team and the public.
